

Twilight + Picnic



Two food gatherings provide a fun outlet for all generations. Thursday night's Presidio Twilight vibe is chill with cabanas, fire pits, and live music. 13 Tennessee Hollow Self-Guided Walk

Many city kids don’t realize all the amazing things happening right beneath their feet. A live archaeology dig outside the Presidio Officers’ Club helps kids learn about the people who’ve walked through the Presidio through time, leaving behind a little piece of themselves along the way.

Western Tanager



For the Birds

In the fall, the Presidio is a great place for an avian safari. Western Tanagers and many other migratory birds make use of the Presidio's habitats for feeding and resting: some will stay for the whole winter!

Coast Buckwheat



Farewell to Summer

Summer wildflowers (like Coast Buckwheat) slowly fade in the fall, dispersing their seeds in time to benefit from the upcoming winter rains.

Pumpkin Spider



A Halloween Treat

The Pumpkin Spider – which gets its name from its bulbous, rust-colored thorax – is particularly active around Halloween.

Poison Oak



Look but Don't Touch

Poison Oak offers a West Coast version of colorful fall foliage before losing its leaves for winter. The natural areas alongside Presidio trails are great places for leaf-peeping.

Autumn sunsets are the most spectacular of the year in the Presidio. You'll find beautiful golden and rose hues all over the western Presidio.
