





OPERATION BABYLIFT: PERSPECTIVES AND LEGACIES *Ends April 3, 2016*

Explore the diverse experiences and lasting impacts of a dramatic airlift that removed more than 2,000 Vietnamese children from their war-torn country to be adopted by American families as Saigon fell in April 1975. At the Presidio, 1,500 of these children were cared for by 5,400 volunteers. Meanwhile, Operation Babylift itself was being debated across the country.

This exhibition and program series is co-curated by the Presidio Trust and the Adoption Museum Project, and was shaped by input from community contributors.

ARCHAEOLOGY LAB TOURS

Meet at the Welcome Desk inside the Presidio Officers' Club

Presidio Trust archaeologists describe the Presidio's archaeological process and the park's current and past excavations. Tours last from 45 minutes to one hour and start at the Welcome Desk inside the Presidio Officers' Club. After a quick visit to the outdoor archaeological site of El Presidio, move into the state-of-the-art lab and collections facility where the Presidio's artifacts are cleaned, catalogued, studied, and curated.
