PRESIDIO TUNNEL TOPS CAMPAIGN

Led by the Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy, the non-profit philanthropic park partner, the Presidio Tunnel Tops campaign has exceeded its \$98 million goal. The new park site is a gift to the City of San Francisco from generous donors and community members who have helped deliver the vision of the Presidio Tunnel Tops from the early stages of park and program design to fruition. The overall project budget is \$118 million, with the Presidio Trust contributing \$20 million and \$98 million raised by Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy. A Legacy of Support in Our Parks

Over the last 40 years, the generous donors and members of the Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy have contributed more than \$575 million in support of the Golden Gate National Parks in the Bay Area's backyard. Iconic places like Fort Baker, Lands End, and Crissy Field in the Presidio have been transformed for the better thanks to this community of dedicated people.

At Crissy Field, with the vision and leadership gifts of the community and generous donors Evelyn and Walter Haas, Jr. Fund, the Parks Conservancy and National Park Service turned a broken concrete parking lot into a beloved park and vital marshland habitat for more than 50 species of plants and animals. The Parks Conservancy has also supported other Presidio projects like Tennessee Hollow Watershed and Mountain Lake restoration, as well as creation of Rob Hill Campground, one of the only campsites within San Francisco.

The Parks Conservancy is working to make our parks more vibrant, more resilient, and more welcoming, with the help of thousands of volunteers and community members. In 2019, the Parks Conservancy, in conjunction with the National Park Service and Presidio Trust, coordinated more than 20,000 volunteers who contributed more than 350,000 volunteer hours (the equivalent of 170 full-time employees).

The impact of the Parks Conservancy comes home at the Crissy Field Center, which hosts more than 15,000 young people every year and helps them connect with the science and cultural history of these places while building leadership skills, exploring careers in and beyond the parks, and fostering a sense of self and community. The expanded Crissy Field Center and youth campus at Presidio Tunnel Tops will take us one big step closer to our goal of reaching 100,000 local young people and families by the year 2023.

We see national parks as catalysts for a better future, made brighter when we work together toward collective solutions. Whether it's adapting to climate change or striving for racial justice and community equity, these efforts intersect with parks to provide a more powerful place for exploring change.

With that clear vision in hand, the future is bright in the parks. We're addressing sea-level rise at Bothin Marsh in Marin County, updating China Beach facilities for the public and NPS ocean rescue teams, and enhancing the Alcatraz visitor experience at Pier 31. The hard work of Parks Conservancy staff and dedication of our donors and members comes together in support of our mission: Parks For All Forever.
