

Paul Goode Field Renovation & Tennessee Hollow Watershed Enhancements begin Fall 2015



The Presidio Trust is in the midst of a multi-year effort to make improvements within the Tennessee Hollow Watershed, with the goals of enhancing natural areas and creating new opportunities for public enjoyment.

The next phase of work has two components: renovation of Paul Goode Field as an athletic facility for youth, and early steps to restore the upper portion of Tennessee Hollow's eastern stream.

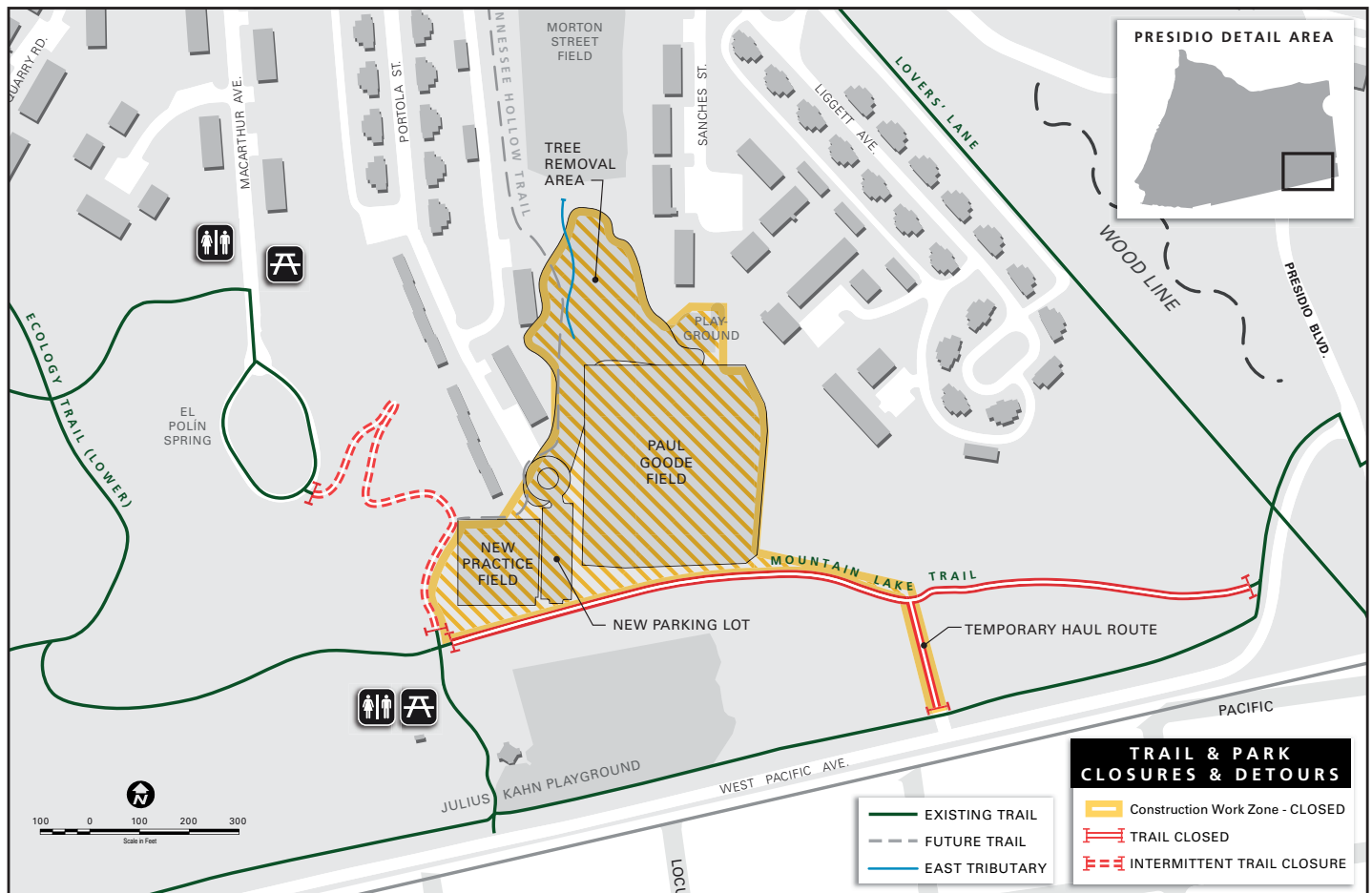
Work is expected to start in fall 2015, beginning with the removal of Blue gum eucalyptus trees north and west of the field. Tree removal, which will take approximately two months, is necessary to allow both for athletic field renovation and to enable the future "daylighting" of the watershed's eastern stream. The removal of these trees was called for in the *2007 Tennessee Hollow Upper Watershed Revitalization Plan and Environmental Assessment*. Following this work, the area will be revegetated with native riparian woodland plants and trees (see reverse).

To facilitate the work and minimize construction traffic impacts, a temporary construction access road will be built

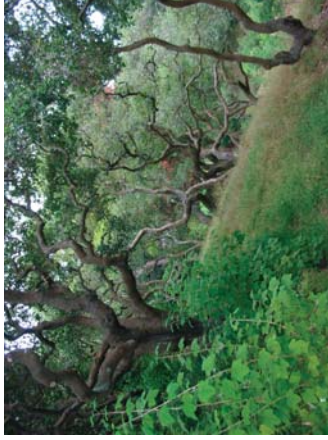
along an existing maintenance road / trail from the south-west corner of Paul Goode Field to West Pacific Avenue. Upon completion, this road will be used as the haul route.

Improvements to Paul Goode Field will occur over approximately fourteen months and include upgrades to the existing play area, construction of a small practice field, and the addition of a new restroom, parking lot, and picnic area. The surface of both fields will be comprised of a synthetic turf using an organic infill system that will reduce annual water usage by an estimated one million gallons. Connections to nearby trails will also be enhanced. The athletic complex will be operated through a licensing agreement and will be available to a broad cross section of schools and youth-based community and non-profit sports organizations.

Work hours will be Monday to Friday, 8 am to 5 pm. The Sanches playground will be closed during tree removals and the Paul Goode Field parking lot will be closed for the duration of the project. Portions of the Mountain Lake Trail and Tennessee Hollow Trail will be closed and signed with alternative routes. For more information, please contact charrell@presidiotrust.gov.
